

JUNGLE BABIES

MARY THE MONKEY

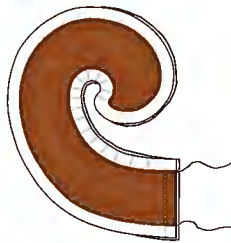

Supplies Needed:

- 1 panel with monkey family
- 2 bags 20 oz Fiberfill

Matching thread or
Wonder Invisible Thread clear

1. Cut out all pieces of each toy and keep in separate stacks.
2. With right sides of tail together stitch around tail as marked.



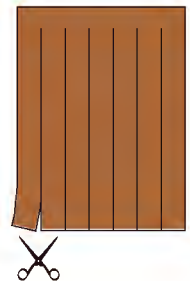
3. Using a chop stick or pencil turn the tail right side out and stuff.

4. Stitch the tail into the center back dart as marked.



5. Sew the dart closed.

6. Cut the top knot along the solid lines making a fringe look, leaving all connected on one edge as marked.



7. Fold the top knot piece in thirds.





8. Stitch together along attached area.



9. Baste in place at the top of the head as marked.



10. With top knot fringe to the inside, put the right sides of the body together. Pin together.

11. Stitch around the whole monkey leaving the bottom open. Turn right side out and check the seam to make sure no white seam allowance is showing.



12. Turn the body back wrong side out. Clip the seams at the marks, being careful not to cut through the stitching.

13. Turn monkey body and ears right side out.

14. Stuff the ears lightly, with most of the stuffing to the outside edges.

15. Top-stitch along the dotted line between ears and the head.



16. Turn the body back wrong side out and continue.

17. Pin bottom oval in place matching opening marks.

18. **Stitch around bottom leaving unstitched between the two notches at the back.**
19. **Stuff monkey through opening area to desired firmness, remember this is a toy and should be a little soft for a baby.**
20. **Fold in the opening seam allowance between the notches, pin in place, and hand sew closed.**
21. **Tie knots in the top knot fringe, one at the base and one at the end of each fringe. This will make the top knot stand up.**

TIMMY THE TIGER

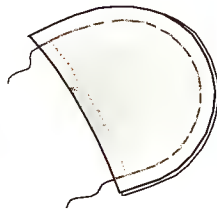

Supplies Needed:

- 1 Fleece Panel
- 1 bag Polyester Fiberfill 20 oz
- Matching thread or
Wonder Invisible Thread clear

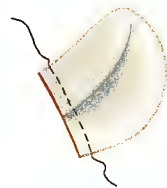
1. Cut out all pieces of each toy and keep in separate stacks.

2. With right sides together stitch around the curved area of the two ears.



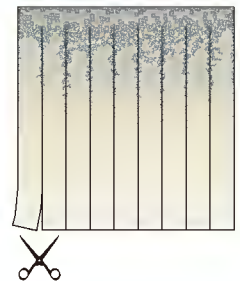
3. Trim the seam allowance being careful not to cut into the seam.

4. Turn the ear right side out. Fold to the notch and baste edge closed.



5. Pin the ears, matching the notches, to the head, with the white side of the ears laying on Timmy's face. Baste ears in place matching the notches.

6. Cut the lines on the top knot piece. Only cut to the end of the lines.



7. Fold top knot piece in thirds.





8. Stitch together along attached area.

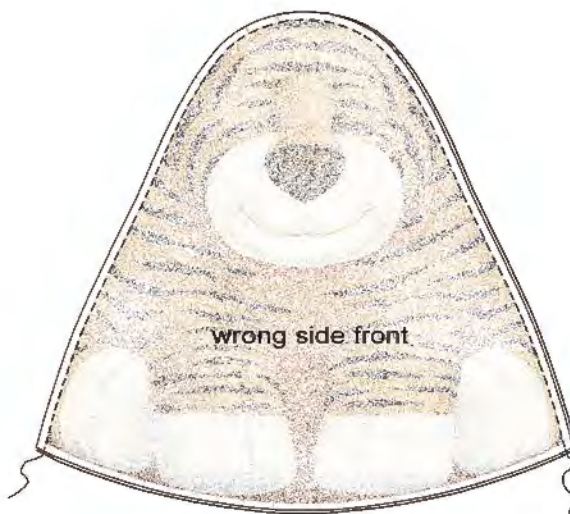


9. Baste the top knot in place at the top of the head as marked.



10. With right sides together, pin the front & back of the Tiger body together, with the top knot and the ears in the middle between the two layers.

11. Stitch along seam allowance leaving the bottom open. Clip in all edges as marked, being careful Not to cut the stitching.



12. Turn right side out and check all seams to make sure you don't have any white seam allowance showing.

13. Turn the body back wrong side out, and continue.
14. Pin bottom oval in place matching opening marks.
15. Stitch around bottom leaving unstitches between the two notches at the back.
16. Stuff Timmy's body with the fiberfill to the desired firmness, remember this is a toy and should be soft for a baby.
17. Fold in the opening seam allowance between the notches, pin in place, and hand sew closed.
18. Tie knots in the top knot fringe. One at the base and one at the end of each fringe. This will make the top knot stand up.
