


# fabric traditions



### **NFL Cornhole Bags**

SKILL LEVEL: BEGINNER

**CRAFTING TIME: 3 HOURS**

## fabric traditions

### Supplies & Tools

- 1/2 yard NFL Cornhole Fabric 100% Cotton Duck in two different patterns\*
- 1/2 yard Heavy weight fabric (Duck fabric suggested)
- One 10lb box of Poly Pellets Weighted Stuffing Beads from Fairfield World
- Basic sewing kit: scissors, pins, needle and thread to match, marking tools, and ruler
- Sewing machine
- Scale

#### **Directions**

- 1. Cut four 7" by 7" squares out of each pattern of NFL Corn Hold Fabric. Cut eight 7" by 7" squares from your heavy weight fabric.
- **2.** Taking one cornhole fabric piece and one heavy weight fabric piece, place them right sides together and pin.
- Sew around the square using a 1/2" seam allowance making sure to leave about a 3" hole for turning. Repeat this step a second time using a 1/4" seam allowance, again making sure to leave about a 3" hole for turning. This will provide extra strength in the stitching making the bags more durable.
  - Clip the corners at an angle to reduce bulk, making sure not to cut the stitch line.
- **4.** Turn the bag right side out through the hole left open. \*Use your fingers or chopsticks to help poke the corners of the bag.
- Fill the bag with as close to 16oz of Poly Pellets Weighted Stuffing Beads as possible.
  \*A funnel works best to help this step.

#### **Directions**

- Close the hole in the bag by either using a top stitch on your sewing machine (fastest method, but bulkiness can make for difficulty sewing) or using an invisible stitch
- (easier method but more time consuming. You will also need to stitch the hole a dew times to make sure it is durable enough to not let any pellets lose)
- **7.** Repeat steps 2 through 6 for the rest of the bags.
- **8.** You should now have 4 bags of one pattern and 4 bags of the other pattern.
- **9.** Test out each bag by playing a game of cornhole. Once the bags pass the test, your ready for tailgating.
